BEST BET: RACE 8, Californiasunshine

First Race

THISGIRLSFORPAPA lost photos in both starts at Ferndale when running for this tag. She's been on an uptick recently at the fairs and has scored both career wins here. She couldn't find an easier field that she meets today as she comes back in only seven days. BEAUTIFUL DREAMER has speed and the perfect outside drawn. She isn't much, but what she has to offer makes her the one to catch here, and that could prove difficult with a perfect outside draw and a seven-pound weight break. A B C ME AWESOME makes her 2016 debut after nearly 1 1/2 years on the sidelines. All three wins came at 4 1/2 furlongs at Los Alamitos. If she shows her usual quickness, she will be a legitimate threat here.

Second Race

FAST PASS has been knocking on the door, and did run the best race of his career when second in his last start here. He's coming off a nice second at Santa Rosa and seems nicely spotted for his graduation. He's usually in good position when the real running begins. KAT MOBILE was eliminated at the break in his debut here last year. He's making his first start in nearly 10 months, but he did finish with interest in his debut. Has several bullets in preparation for this comeback. NEVADAN has hit the board in both starts at the bargain-basement level. He's shown enough that the barn is giving him a mild boost here.

Third Race

Did a trip to Ferndale wake up THE GOLD MONKEY? He dropped to this level and ran second in both starts there following a private sale. He was favored both times, closing well late and then running evenly the second time. He's making a quick turnaround, but, at his best, he's a legitimate contender in this spot. WAKE is 0-for-23 here but has hit the board seven times. Woke up on the turf last time at Santa Rosa against better despite a late fade. Has a pair of easy maintenance drills since then. HIGH GREELEY was privately purchased after being claimed away from this barn earlier. He scored a game

win at this distance here in first start for this trainer off a claim, only to be disqualified all the way back to fifth. Maybe she can turf him around again.

Fourth Race

ROGER WAY has made two starts since returning from a 15-month layoff. Did little against better on the turf, but was given a huge drop and responded with a confidence-building eight-length win here. He get a double jump up the ladder here, but he's hit the board in all six starts here, including last year when he was meeting better. MORNING STORM has alternated wins and seconds in his part four starts while running at the fairs. He's run well here in the past and should be a major player with his stalking speed and rail draw. ROCK ÆN ON HOME won his first two starts here before falling apart late. He bounced back when give a nine-week freshener and ran second here against easier last time. The effort inspired the barn to run him against tougher here.

Fifth Race

BUYMEABOND likes this course and is coming off a win for this tag when he dead heated at Del Mar last out. He's sharp and came back with an excellent five-furlong bullet here to indicate he's at the top of his game. Watch for him late. MISTAKEN IDENTITY has won five of his past six. He has one win and lost a photo on the turf here. Loves the course and has won at the distance. Hasn't run in two months, but he's recorded solid works during his freshener. ROYAL BANKER is adding blinkers today as he comes north for the first time after being claimed by Hall of Fame barn. Doe have three works here and did win against comparable company earlier this year down south.

Sixth Race

BELLA GALINA set the pace before tiring in the lane in her debut here at this level. This is a tough track for speedsters in their first starts so she gets extra credit for the good try in which she held second easily. Though barn is 0-for-10 with second-time maidens, it does well with maiden claimers. We'll look for her to be a factor again with that one under her belt. LIANAÍS WARRIOR is out of a stakes-place dam who won nearly one-quarter million dollars. She's by a solid win-early sire and from a barn that shows a nice profit with first-timers in the claiming ranks. STARBRIGHT moves to a new barn after a runner-up effort in Santa Rosa. She has worked twice since, including a half-mile bullet in her final drill.

Seventh Race

AVENTADOR is a French stakes winner in his native land who has been running against cheaper of late. But he's been running so well, this step up doesn't seem a problem. He just won on the turf at Santa Rosa and has run second in both starts on the turf here. Stalker should be in good position heading for home. PRESIDENTSKY looks to be a good fit at this level. He's run against better for most of the past two years and is coming off a victory against \$25K optional claimers in his last start at Santa Rosa. Has a decent maintenance drill here since then. He likes this course and has hit the board in all his starts at this distance. ADMINISTER is basically a sprinter. He's tried this distance twice and did finish third once. No reason he can't wait a bit long before unleashing his strong closing kick.

Eighth Race

CALIFORNIA SUNSHINE is making her third start of the year and cutting back to a sprint as she makes her Nocal debut. Hall of Fame barn seems to be looking for an easy spot and may have found it. She's gone a mile in both starts, but her fractions, plus that final 1:14.20 six-furlong drill suggest she'll be a major force in the lane here. First-timer FIRST AMENDMENT hasn't missed a beat since beginning training. Can't work much better than she worked in August with bullets at three, four and five furlongs and then a 1:12.80 six-furlong work on a day when no one else went six furlongs. EXPLOSIVE RUN draws the rail for her debut, and she, too, has some eye-popping works. She a half to millionaire Cost of Freedom, and her three-furlong works hint at quickness that will keep her out of trouble despite the rail draw.

Ninth Race

TACOLA never came close in three tries against straight maidens in Kentucky. He has decent turf breeding, being by Kitten's Joy, and coming here when he'll be running at the bottom maiden claiming level should make him a much tougher customer. Condition could be question as he moves west, but he does have a pair of works at Emerald Downs before coming down here when he can run on turf. MANITBOOZE CRUISED for his tag in his lone start over this course. He was freshened for seven weeks and ran all right against better at Santa Rosa. Should be tougher with that one under his belt. He's stepping up after setting the pace before losing by a neck at Santa Rosa. It was a good effort, and he seems a candidate to be included on the lower end of your exotics.
